Imagine being given 20 years' salary in one go and putting it under your bed. That's what happens in today's gospel when the master gives five talents, three talents and one talent to his servants. A talent was a coin that was worth almost 20 years pay for a servant, so the first servant actually got 100 years' salary, the second got 60 years' in advance and the man who got 20 years' pay simply buried it in the ground. What excuse do we make for not using the talents that God has given to us? Many people say that God really has given them nothing special to do in their lives but today's Gospel clearly shows that everyone has been given some role by God and every baptised Christian has been called to spread the good news of Jesus Christ. Other people are quick to compare, they say they are not as good as So-and-So and what's the point of their stepping forward when others are 'more talented'? Yet God does not judge us in comparison with others and what they may or may not be capable of doing. God knows what we are capable of, and he expects us only to respond in the fullest way we can. Perhaps the saddest people are those who have convinced themselves that God is asking too much of them. God expects us to bring a return on the talents he has given us. It means taking risks, it means stretching ourselves for the sake of the gospel, and it means putting our whole hearts into practising our faith. So if God were to ask you today what you have done with talents that you were given, would you know what your talents are and would you be able to show how you have been cooperating with the Holy Spirit to try and make them grow?
