The 'Homeless Jesus' statue was sculpted by Timothy Schmalz to bring attention to the problem of homelessness in Toronto. It depicts a homeless person on a bench, covered in a blanket. On closer inspection there is a noticeable characteristic, the person bears the wounds of crucifixion.

This is Jesus, the homeless wandering preacher. Christians are divided about it... some are enthusiastic others find it 'offensive', 'provocative' and 'not an appropriate image'. The 'Homeless Jesus' statue eventually found a home - a place where Christians were not afraid to acknowledge Jesus in the most marginalised.

The parable today is a simple tale about two brothers, one who eventually shows through his actions that he has heard a message, the other who does not. The chief priests listening to the parable are forced to admit that it is the first brother who has acted correctly. However, they are behaving more like the second. Jesus says: 'the tax collectors and prostitutes are going into the Kingdom ahead of you'.
