Over fifty years ago, in his famous 'I have a dream' speech, Martin Luther King Jr talked about 'the fierce urgency of now'.

'This is no time to engage in the luxury of cooling off or to take the tranquilising drug of gradualism. Now is the time to make justice a

reality for all of God's children... The whirlwinds of revolt will continue to shake the foundations of our nation until the bright day of justice emerges,' he said.

That same sense of 'fierce urgency' seems to grab the disciples in today's Gospel. The time has come, says Jesus - and Simon, Andrew, James and John are certainly ready. Golborne Rail Station

A meeting chaired by Andy Burnham took place on Thursday 4th January at Parkside Sports & Community Club to discuss Golborne Station which is due to be opened in 2027. The current proposal, subject to consultation and business case, is to build a new station near to the site of the previous Golborne Station which will have an hourly service between Wigan and Stalybridge (via Manchester Victoria). The meeting was to listen to the views of the community and will be used to inform the next stages of the development of the scheme, ahead of the final business case being submitted to the government early in 2025. Asylum-Seekers Project

The Asylum-Seekers Project was started in January 2020 as an extension of a small group of dedicated knitters from our two churches who had already been producing garments for charity. They agreed to support Asylum-Link UK in Liverpool and when this centre closed temporarily because of lock-down, they transferred their efforts to the Centre in Wigan where one of our parishioners is a volunteer and where the need is very great because of the large number of destitute individuals and families arriving with no possessions. As a result of an appeal in our newsletter, more people joined in and the word quickly spread through families and friends of members; there are now 19 enthusiasts beavering away at home in Culcheth, Croft, Golborne, Lowton, Ashton and Leigh and they produce an astonishing number of beautiful garments and blankets. The most recent batch went off just before Christmas and contained 105 garments, 16 blankets and 3 sacks of good-as-new items for adults and children.

This brought the total for 2023 to 517 garments, 81 blankets and 29 sacks of good-as-new.

The grand total since we started in January 2020 is 1,765 garments, 244 blankets and 107 sacks of good-as-new.
