Many of Jesus' parables are difficult. We are invited to place ourselves in the story. Which character do we identify with? To which group would we belong? Sometimes we find ourselves sympathising with the character who turns out to be in the wrong. God's ways are not our ways!

The parable of the labourers in the vineyard is one of those tricky ones. We are drawn into the story, and we feel some sympathy for the crowd who end up grumbling at the landowner. These early birds who were hired at daybreak have done the most work. They have toiled all day in the heat, doing far more labour than those who were hired only at the last minute – yet they all receive the same pay. It's hardly fair, is it? But the landowner makes his point: 'Why be envious because I am generous?' Of course, Jesus anticipates the discomfort of his audience. He uses parables to gently pull the rug from under their feet, to challenge their assumptions, and offer them a new way of thinking that is focused not on themselves, but on the wider community.

Place yourself in the story. If you identify with the grumblers, ask yourself why. Why should we be concerned about what others are getting? Who are we to judge what others deserve? Surely we, too, should want God's love and blessings to be extended to everyone!

Care for Creation

In response to the Archdiocese scheme 'Care for Creation' and a need to become more sustainable, 3 raised beds have been constructed adjacent to the cemetery at All Saints church. In these we intend to grow fruit and vegetables for All Saints foodbank, wildflowers to increase biodiversity and flowers for decorating the church, to reduce our carbon footprint associated with imported flowers. To date, the materials needed for our raised beds have been donated and we have a plan to construct more beds. In addition to asking if anyone would like to help either with the construction of the beds and maintenance (*mainly weeding*), we would be more than grateful for donations of wood, paint and topsoil. As the vegetables are intended for the Foodbank we are also asking if you could donate seeds for vegetables and flowers, of course planting will depend on the seasons and the varieties to be planted. **If you are able to donate any seeds or bulbs there is a box in the porch.
